

Information for third countries on the movement of small animals to EE exhibitions held in Schengen countries

In addition to the veterinary conditions to be met by the Schengen area and the exhibition management, third countries still need:

A certificate from the official veterinarian on the clinical freedom from illnesses, the required vaccinations, the freedom of disease in the area of origin and, for psittacites, the required CITES documents.

As a European document, EE exhibitions are covered by Directive 92/65 / EEC. For clarification of facts and terms, please refer to the "Working Document on the Animal Health Conditions for International Poultry and Bird Exhibitions in the Member States of the EU", which is available on the EE and EC web-sites.

Upon entry into the Schengen area, timely information of the respective border post about the type and quantity of small animals and the time of arrival for arrival and return travel is urgently required, so that clearance can be made quickly.
